In a Medicare Advantage Plan?

You can still make a change!

From Jan 1 - March 31, if you're in a Medicare Advantage Plan, you can switch plans or return to Original Medicare and join a separate Medicare drug plan.

Did you miss your opportunity to enroll in Medicare Parts A or B?

Every year the General
Enrollment Period (GEP) for
Medicare occurs between
January 1 and March 31. This is
the time—and usually the only
time—during which people who
are eligible for Medicare Parts A
and/or B but did not do so when
first eligible have another
opportunity to join.

2023 Medicare Part D Insulin Coverage Changes

Starting January 1, 2023, plans can't charge you more than \$35 for a one-month supply of each Medicare Part D-covered insulin you take, and can't charge you a deductible for insulin.

NH FAMILY CAREGIVER PROGRAM

A family caregiver is anyone who provides regular care for a relative, a partner or a friend. The amount of care that the family member or other individual provides may have increased over time, or they may have found themselves in that role suddenly, without notice. For many it is a labor of love but it can also be physically and emotionally demanding. It is important to keep a balance between caring for another individual while caring for oneself.

LONG TERM CARE OPTIONS

The New Hampshire Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) is committed to providing home and community based services as an alternative to nursing facility placement.

The Choices for Independence (CFI) Program is a Medicaid-funded program that provides a wide range of service choices that enable eligible adults to stay in their own homes and communities.
